This is a non-taxable supplement for low-income seniors of **up to \$1,097.75 per month**. Approximately 2.2 million Canadians rely on this vital program for everyday essentials.

TO QUALIFY FOR THE BENEFIT YOU MUST:

 Be 65 years old or older

 Be a Canadian resident

 Receive the **Old Age Security (OAS)** pension and

 Receive an income that is **below the maximum annual income threshold** based on your marital status
